PRINCIPALS REPORT

This term we have welcomed a number of new staff to Peel High School in the teaching, COVID team and non teaching staff. We have also had a number of long term temporary staff appointed on a permanent basis which is good news for the school and the individuals.

NAPLAN reports have been sent home with year 7 and 9 students. You will notice that the reporting scale has changed. I have included further information about the proficiency levels below:

Students' results will show how they performed in each of the NAPLAN assessment areas against 4 new proficiency levels:

- Exceeding: The student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.
- Strong: The student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.
- Developing: The student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.
- Needs additional support: The student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.

Education Week was celebrated across the state marking 175 years of Public Education in NSW. At a school level we celebrated the contribution of students and staff to Peel High School, with staff nominating students and students nominating staff. All were announced at the Education Week Assembly on 2 August 2023.



The Peel Network Education Week Awards were hosted this year by Tamworth South Public School on 3 August, with a student, staff member and community member recognised by each school.

Thank you to everyone who attended and shared in the celebrations of the day.

Dear Parents and Carers

The NSW Government has announced restrictions on the use of mobile phones in NSW high schools beginning in Term 4, 2023 for Year 7 to Year 12 students. Peel High School will be making changes to the way mobile phones are used by students during the school day.

The new system is being implemented to increase focus in classrooms, remove distractions and to also promote positive social interaction, while reducing the potential for online bullying.

The new mobile phone plan at Peel High School will occur during all school hours, including break times such as during lunch and recess, as well as while students are on school-based excursions.

Students will still be able to carry their phones while travelling to and from school.

We wish to advise that students will not be able to use their mobile phone to pay for food at the canteen in Term 4. Students will need to use a key card or cash to purchase food.



- Students receive 5 House Points and a Positive Attendance Letter is sent home










NAIDOC BALL

On 28th-30th July, Madi competed at The World Dance Masters Championships where she represented Team Australia and competed against fellow dancers from all across the world!


