

AWESOME AGRICULTURE

NORTHERN SCHOOLS PRIME STEER COMPETITION

During week 4, 19 students and 6 show cattle headed up to Tenterfield for the Northern Schools Prime Steer Competition. This was the conclusion to the students hard work and preparation over Term 3 and 4, which involved the students during sport and their breaks to work the cattle ready for competition.

Over the 2 days, students participated in Junior Judging, Pararders Competition and presented our cattle for Judging.

In the Junior Judging Zara Kesby won the Year, 1st place in the Stage 5 division. Henry Crittle got 2nd and Makayla Trimbath got 3rd place in the Stage 4 division. Bindi Issac got 2nd place in the stage 6 division and also 3rd place in stage parades.

In the judging of our cattle we got 4th place in the Heavy Weight with our Limo cross steer called T bone. We got serval positive comments on the quality of our cattle considering they were grown on pasture and grain assistance finished. We grew out our cattle on pasture rather than feedlot to not only reduce our inputs into the program, but to also work on producing high quality cattle in a sustainable manner. Mr McCabe and Mr Bowman would like to thank the students for their hard work in preparing the cattle and also to our farm Assistant Michelle, for keeping the cattle going behind the scenes.

Form must be completed by a Parent/Carer and returned for Principal approval, prior to leave commencing


AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL WOOL JUDGING FINALS

In the school holidays, Zara Kesby travelled to Melbourne to represent NSW in the National Merino Fleece Judging Finals. She competed in the top 6 judges for 15-25 year olds in Australia. This involved her judging of fleeces assessing the colour, crimp, strength, uniformity of length and yield. Zara had to speak on her placings and provide feedback to the overjudge of why she placed the fleeces in the rank she did. Zara ended up coming 4th in the competition, which is an amazing achievement to be the 4th placed wool judge in Australia. She spoke well and represented NSW with pride. This was the conclusion of a 12 month journey from qualifying for our group 14 district, wining first place at Sydney royal and finally competing at Melbourne. We at Peel High School are extremely proud of Zara's achievement and wish her the best in her future agricultural competitions.









WOOLWORTHS GETS SUPPORT FROM SUPPORT

Students from the Support Unit participated in the Woolworths Partnership with TAFE NSW program this Term. The concept for this initiative was to provide a practical and real-life authentic learning environment for students and young people with disabilities. The purpose was to educate and train students to increase opportunities to build on their communication skills, numeracy and literacy skills, and interpersonal skills and increase their independence and confidence so they can live and work in their communities.

The retail environment had fully functioning registers, shelving, fresh food displays, ticketing, shopping baskets and real products supplied by Woolworths. It had signage, weekly catalogues, uniforms – caps, aprons and badges. Students learned real life skills, equipping them with the knowledge of how retail works from the perspective of both a customer and a team member and crucially, the confidence to shop in store. This program assists with transition to employment and potentially work in a retail environment with skills such as customer service skills, communication and interpersonal skills, critical thinking and problem solving, attention to detail, teamwork and money handling.
